We have an updated 72 Hour Disaster Kit Yes No	Keep the disaster kit stocked and a go-bag to take along if an evacuation is necessary. Make sure it includes important personal documents. Locations where we've stored our disaster kits/go-bag:	
Family Emergency Plan	Keep our Family Emergency Plan up to date. Meet with household members every 6 months or as needed to update these plans.	
Stay Informed	Sign up for local emergency weather alerts from <u>FEMA.gov</u> or <u>Red-Cross.org</u> apps and know what is going on in your area.

# **Additional Steps for Preparedness:**

- ✓ Ensure each family member has a current photo of every other family member in their cell phone. Post photos of each family member on the back of this plan (especially important for young children and those without cell phones).
- ✓ Ensure each family member has an updated copy of this Family Emergency Plan (e.g. a snapshot in their cell phone).
- ✓ Ensure digital copies of important documents (e.g. passports, driver's license, etc.) are stored securely offsite.
- ✓ Notify emergency contacts and extended family members about your Family Emergency Plan.
- ✓ Update this plan every 6 months or as needed, and keep printouts of the most updated plan in a visible location and a copy in your emergency kit.
